PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

John Maihos, President

Parish Council News

I'd like to give you a quick update on all the work being doing on the church campus, but that's not really possible. There have been so many changes, and more are to come. When the curtains are drawn, the picture will be beautiful. My best advice.... Come and See.

The two main things I want to talk about are giving and giving. That sounds like only one, but duplicated, so let me explain.



First, there is financial giving, or support of our church community. Let me suggest that you really have little choice over what to give. For some, there is no control. Hear me out. We all have responsibilities in this life of ours, and those responsibilities cost money. You may have some debt from the purchase of a car, or home which takes up a part of your income. If you want to eat, you have the ongoing monthly expense of food, and all the other things that bring us comfort and enjoyment. And of course, you may want to save for your future, or your children's future, of if you blessed enough, your grandchildren's future. How can you find an extra dollar for any else?

The fact is, we do find ways to support what we love, need, or really want in life.

The church is like a life, a living being, that has the same concerns. We have things that must be paid for from our past purchases. We have ongoing fees to keep the lights on, offer liturgical services and special programs, and we have plans for the future of our parish, including the future parishioners who are only passing thoughts in the minds of our young people who will eventually have families in the church.

At St. Vasilios, we have a beautiful life. We have two devoted priests whose involvement in your life is as little or as much as you want. Our services offer a safe place not just for our children, but for us. It's like a weekly recharging of our soul. The programs at St. Vasilios include Church School, Greek School, Choir, Men's Club, Philoptochos, Goya, Junior Goya, Little Lambs, St. Stephen's, Kalee Parea, and more. Bible Study is offered. Those who are interested in the Orthodox faith can receive instruction. We do a lot!

The other type of giving is the giving of time. With the fesitval over Memorial Day weekend this year, we will need all hands on deck to make this a success. We need people who may never have volunteered before. We need the people who come every year to make it a point to come this year. We need you.

So please, consider these two giving opportunities, and be as generous as you can be. Elsewhere in the newsletter you will read about our Parish Advancement Campaign (PAC) and our Annual Stewardship program. If you can consider \$5,000 this year for the PAC (paid over multiple years), that would be wonderful. If not, consider whatever gift you can freely give. As for Stewardship.... I hope one day in the future, we raise enough money from Stewardship as we need to run all our programs. (On average, that's around \$1000 per family per year.) The thing about a Stewardship program is that those who can give more, give more, because we know that not everyone can give at that level. Still, maybe it can be a future goal of yours. Let's do this for what we've already invested in, what we are currently doing, and what we hope to do in the future.

I look forward to seeing everyone during Holy Week and into the new season.


Construction Update

We are making great progress on the construction phase of our Parish Advancement Campaign. Our architects, Spencer Preservation Group, and our General Contractor, ZVI, have worked with us seamlessly, on a daily basis, since last June to keep this project on track and on budget.

Since our last update, we have completed the installation of the new elevator and lift as well as completed the new ceiling and lighting in the Educational Center lobby.







In the coming weeks, we will be commissioning the new elevator, installing new flooring in the lobby, classrooms and parlor room, completing the connector between the Educational Center and the Church and installing a new HVAC system in the lobby, parlor room and youth room.





There are only a limited amount of white robes so they will be distributed on a first come first serve basis.




